Enlarging Hearts, Expanding Minds: Kingdom Living in the 21st Century

We are not all hearts nor are we all brains. We are created to love as well as to think. Historians say the early Christians out-loved and out-think their neighbors, their persecutors as well as their enemies. Should the 21st century disciples of Jesus the Messiah be any less? The Word of God is the same yesterday and today. Yet each generation cannot escape the hard work of working out for itself what it means to follow Jesus in our own world — a world that is an intriguing juxtaposition of bullock carts alongside BMWs, skyscrapers and slums, doctors and shamans, have nots and have yachts...! Meanwhile large section of the church is incapacitated from within by poor or shallow Theology of Creation, Work and Redemption. Important questions like "How does one live as a follower of our Lord Jesus in a world which the Holy Scripture declares is our Father's world but yet is marred and disfigured by sin and evil?" is given a short shrift if not out rightly ignored. Even the very word 'Blessing' is diminished to God giving "me" a comfortable lifestyle on earth.

It's vital we remind ourselves that the final word on 'following Christ' or 'how to be the church' aren't penned down yet. Else there would have been no need to write anything on Polity and Society after St Augustine or on Philosophy after Thomas Aquinas and so on. They were faithful in their own times. Should we be less? The Psalmist declares that the earth and everything in it is created by God. But for all that the naked eye can see under the sun, the world is run by humans with their idea, with their philosophy, their vision of what politics, economics, family and society should be. God so loved the world meant God cares for the physical environment, the social, political and economic systems where the lives of His creation (us and flora and fauna) is embedded. Salvation for the Christian is not an escape from this world. We will be judged and rewarded depending upon how faithfully we articulate the Good News—the Gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ in our own world, be it Northeast India, North India, Central or South India or beyond.

If it were so easy to read the Bible by oneself and understand everything! Polycarp had John, Mark had Peter, Timothy had Paul and Paul had a Gamaliel (not a Christian!)—the Holy Spirit used human mentors. Who do you have?

The Artificial Intelligence geek working in a NASA lab is as much beloved by, and created in the image of God as is the tribal or the adivasi in Jharkhand or Arunachal. What does God's good news mean to them? The 21st Century world of Rocket Science and Nanotechnology is a world beyond the comprehension of St Paul or Peter. But what they wrote in the inspiration of the Holy Spirit continues to be relevant today for the physicist pushing himself to unlock the mystery of Nuclear Fusion or the medical scientist involved in stem cell research.

The Intensive Summer Study 2017 is for those who are not satisfied with the status quo – people who yearn for a deeper, richer experience of God, people who wish to transform ordinary living into extraordinary accomplishment in time by the power of the Spirit.

Some of the topics that will be explored this year are: Evil and ethnic conflicts, Holiness, History of Science, Technology& Society, International Relations and Global Economy, Understanding the Scripture better and so on. As you come you will find yourself to have your hearts enlarged and your minds expanded- a slight glimpse or a taste of how God sees and want you to see.
