

Publish Workshop

Preparation

The goal of the journal writing workshop is to assemble a journal article, but before we can do this in the workshop you need to have a few things completed:

1. Your main contribution – you need to have figured out the main contribution to the literature that your research will make. How does it add value? What need does it address? Why would this be interesting to a reader? Have this figured out prior to the workshop

2. *Literature review* – you need to have read the key literature for your article, and have identified the key points from it that you might like to draw on in writing your introduction and other relevant sections of your manuscript.

Bring relevant literature with you.

3. Data analysis

a) Quantitative analysis – you need to have completed all of your data analysis and have your final models ready for inclusion in your paper

b) Qualitative analysis – if you have conducted qualitative research, you need to have completed your thematic analysis and content analysis (if relevant). Your themes need to have been identified, and the quotes for illustrating each theme. You should also have a good idea about the points you wish to make about each theme. If you are using qualitative research inductively to organically develop theory, you need to have done this prior to the workshop. That is, you should have developed your conceptual model/theory prior to the workshop.

4. Review papers

Some participants may be considering writing a review paper during the workshop. This may also lead to the development of a new conceptual model. If this is the case, prior to the workshop you need to have identified (1) each of the main themes that you wish to cover in the review, (2) the main points that you want to cover in each theme area, and (3) the relevant literature for each

theme area. If you are planning to use the review to develop a conceptual model, the conceptual model should have been developed prior to the workshop.

Close reviewer

If possible, arrange with a colleague in a similar area to be a close reviewer for each other.

Other

* Consider bringing a cushion or pillow to sit on

* bring a computer screen, mouse and keyboard as well as a laptop (or alternative devices) so that you maintain good posture during the workshop

* Lock these dates into your diary. If you have clashes - please try to reschedule other work as the workshop's dates are fixed.
